Yu-Ting Chung is a Taiwanese artist based in London. Her practice investigates how jing (境) emerges through relationships between bodies, materials and elemental forces, inviting alternative ways of perceiving and inhabiting space. Rather than treating space as a fixed container, she explores how perception is reoriented through encounters with atmosphere, movement and the continual formation of space.

Drawing from East Asian spatial thought and the sensibilities of island environments, she explores painting as a spatial language. She works across painting, installation, murals and artist publications. Through suspended cotton, mineral pigments, ink and natural materials, she preserves traces of brush, splash and material resistance, allowing works to remain open to transformation. Air, water, gravity, light and time become active forces within the making process, while materials register these encounters.

She holds an MA in Digital Direction from the Royal College of Art, and both a BFA and MFA in Fine Art (Multi-media) from Taipei National University of the Arts. Her work has been exhibited and commissioned across the UK, Europe and Taiwan.

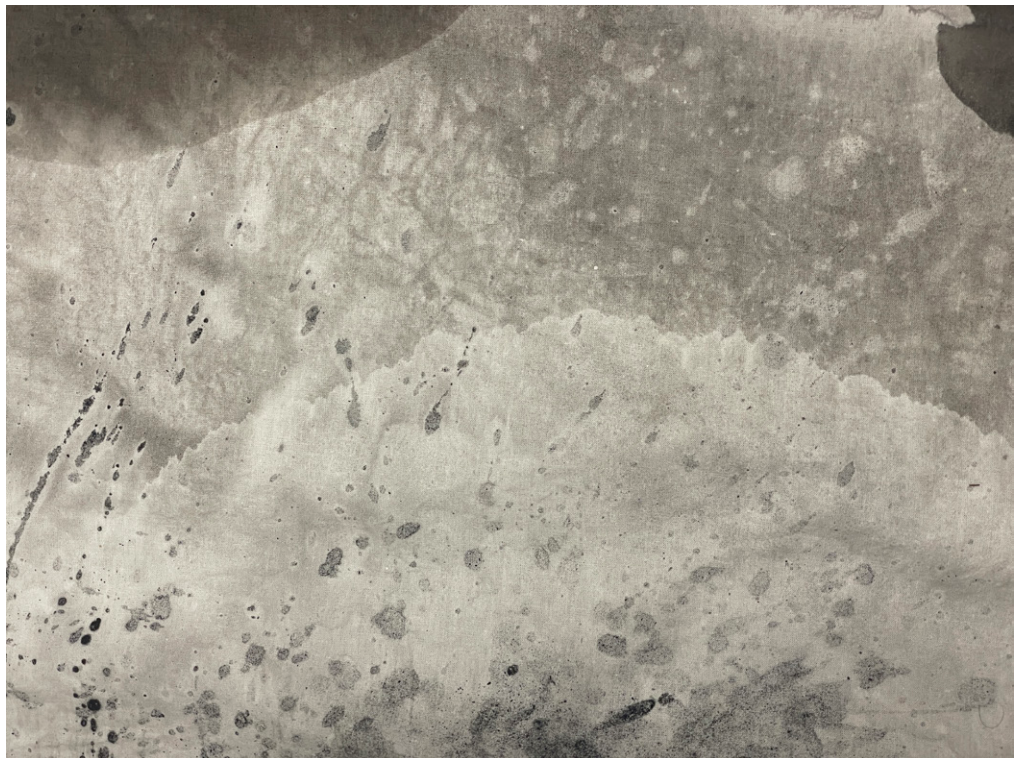
Through suspended fabric, natural forces such as water, gravity, air and time participate in the transformation of the work.

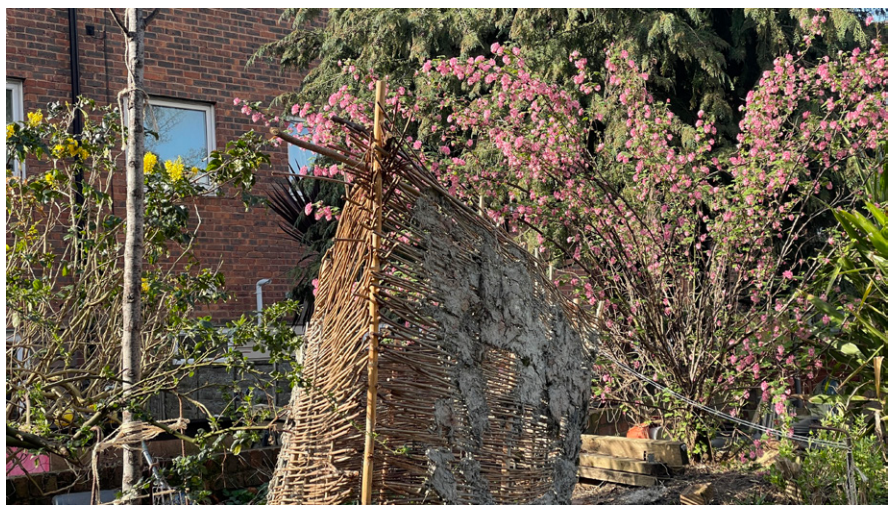

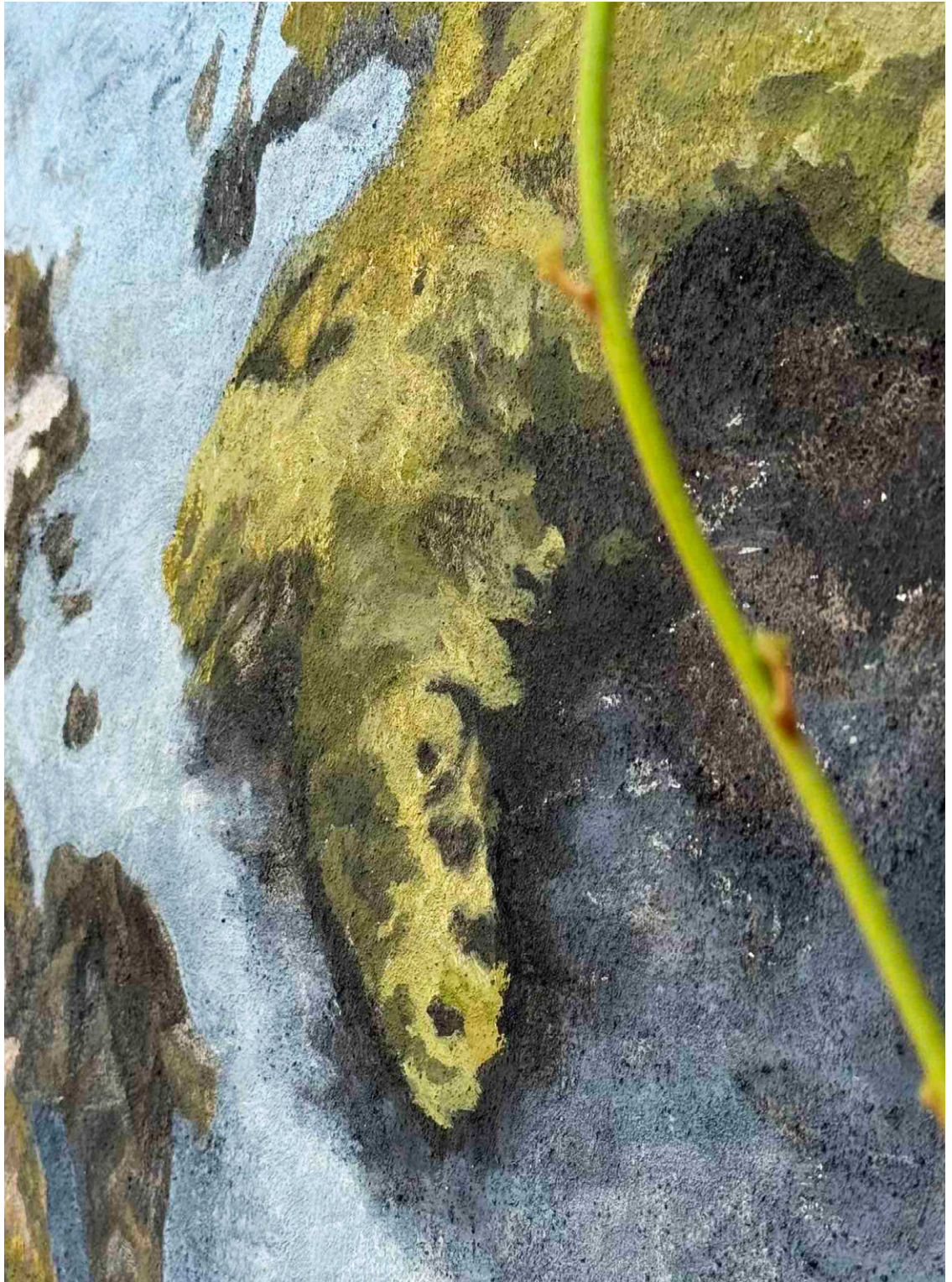
